In the following months, the health article will discuss types of cancer: Hodgkin Lymphoma, Non Hodgkin Lymphoma, & Multiple Myeloma. This month will be

about Hodgkin Lymphoma.

Lymphoma is a form of cancer that affects the immune system. It is a cancer of the immune cells called lymphocytes which are a white blood cell. These cells are in the lymph nodes, spleen, and bone marrow. These lymphocytes change in structure and then grow out of control. Lymph nodes are found in the neck or upper chest. They can be found in the armpit or groin area.

Hodgkin Lymphoma is a cancer of the blood and bone marrow. It is one of the most curable kinds of cancer. It is named after Dr. Thomas Hodgkin, who in 1832 saw how cells were changing. In the late 1900's, it was renamed Hodgkin Lymphoma. Hodgkin Lymphoma is the most curable form of cancer.

There are no obvious risk factors to why a person develops Hodgkin Lymphoma. People who have been diagnosed with mononucleosis have 3 times more of a chance to develop Hodgkin Lymphoma. Occasionally siblings of patients tend to have a higher rate of developing the disuse. You cannot catch the disease from anyone.

Some of the signs and symptoms are fever without an obvious cause, persistent cough, shortness of breath, night sweats, tiredness, unexplained weight loss, and enlarged spleen.

Some of the tests a physician may order are a chest x-ray, CT of the abdomen, and MRI of chest and pelvis. Diagnosis is made by biopsying an enlarged lymph node. If the node is positive, then the oncologist will "stage the disease". "Staging" identifies the extent of the disease and its location. "Staging" tests include blood tests, imaging, and bone marrow tests. The blood test is done to evaluate the level of the cells, protein levels, liver function, and others. A bone marrow test is done to see if the disease has spread. During a bone marrow biopsy, a

small amount of fluid is removed from the marrow.

The oncologist will determine what type of treatment to be used. The patient is evaluated to see if there is evidence of heart disease, kidney disease, lung disease, or anemia before deciding on the treatment. Treatment may consist of chemotherapy, drug therapy, possibly radiation, or stem cell transplant. The physician may also suggest the patient participate in a clinical study. Treatment may be dependent on the person's age. Some of the drugs may too toxic for older people. Children diagnosed with Hodgkin Lymphoma will have a different treatment therapy than adults. In children, it is important to use drugs that lessen the risk of infertility when they grow alder. More than 75% of patients can be cured. In younger people the rate of cure is 90%.
